Dear Exhibitor,

As always, please read these rules carefully because there have been several changes and additions since last year. We want to ensure that your exhibit qualifies for the class you are entering and meets the size limitations and other requirements. If you have any questions, please contact the chairperson of the division you are entering.

The show will run for three days - Thursday March 2nd, Friday March 3rd and Saturday March 4th. The hours of the show are 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

Entry forms are accepted in the order the Artistic and Scientific Exhibit Chairpersons receive them. Their addresses can be found on the entry forms. The Division Chairpersons reserve the right to limit the number of items per exhibitor if entries exceed the available space. All entry forms must be received by February 1, 2023. Entries in both Divisions will no longer be accepted once the available exhibition space has been exceeded.

Show entries must be brought to the **Sanibel Community House**, **2173 Periwinkle Way**, **on Tuesday**, **February 28 between 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM**. Because parking is limited at the Community House, please move your vehicle to the parking area across the street as soon as your exhibits are unloaded.

All exhibits must be removed on Saturday, March 4th between 4:15 PM and **no later than 6:00 PM**.

2023 SANIBEL SHELL SHOW - SCIENTIFIC EXHIBITOR PACKET

PLEASE NOTE THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

<u>APPLICATIONS</u>

The deadline for receiving Scientific is February 1, 2023.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

To promote the highest quality at the Sanibel Shell Show, all awards, except "People's Choice," will only be given if the Judges determine an entry is deserving of a given award because of quality and content.

An exhibit entered as the sole contender within a given class must fulfill the parameters of a high-quality exhibit, in the Judges opinion, in order to win a First Place award in that class. Likewise, if there are only two exhibits within a class, it does not guarantee a First Place and Second Place winner.

SCIENTIFIC DIVISION

RULE 2. Total exhibit width is limited to 40 feet. Every effort is made to avoid wrapping exhibits. Note- If the width of the exhibit changes from what is stated on the entry form, the exhibitor is required to notify the Scientific Chair no later than two weeks prior to the shell show. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of the exhibit.

BEST OF THE BLUES: Limited to any exhibit that has previously won a Blue Ribbon at any past Sanibel Shell Show. This exhibit cannot have won a major award at any shell show. These exhibits are eligible for the du Pont Trophy and the Conchologists of America Award.

SANIBEL PLATINUM AWARD: Limited to exhibits that have previously won any major award, such as du Pont, C.O.A., Smithsonian or American Museum of Natural History Award, Masters, Superstar, Mote Gold, or Clench at any shell show.

VERY IMPORTANT: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to notify the Scientific Chair if the exhibit wins a major award elsewhere after the entry form is submitted.


2023 SANIBEL SHELL SHOW RULES

GENERAL SHOW RULES - Applicable to both Scientific and Artistic Division Exhibits

- 1. Exhibitor may enter more than one class, but no more than one entry per class.
- 2. Entry applications are accepted on a space-available basis. They will be accepted in the order in which they are received. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to select the appropriate entry class. Entry class may not be changed after the Application Due Date except with approval of the Division Chairperson.
- **3.** The contents of each exhibit must be the property of the exhibitor no borrowed specimens or art pieces. When an exhibit is a collaboration, the names of all exhibitors must appear on the entry form.
- **4.** As judging is anonymous, the exhibitor's name or photos of themselves must not be visible on any exhibit until after judging is completed. This is especially pertinent to the artist's name or initials on individual artistic exhibit items.
- 5. Exhibitors shall check in and set up exhibits at the Sanibel Community House at 2173 Periwinkle Way only between the hours of 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM on Tuesday, Feb 28th, 2023. Each exhibitor is responsible for obtaining his/her own help for carrying in his/her exhibit(s). Exhibitors must move their vehicle to the parking lot across the street after unloading. Immediately after setting up exhibits, exhibitors must exit the display room unless he/she is working with a Chairperson of the Shell Show. If an exhibitor cannot check in until after 4:00 PM, the exhibitor must make special arrangements with the Division Chairperson to check in later.
- 6. Arrangement and exact placement of exhibits will be determined by Shell Show officials and not by exhibitors. Accordingly, no exhibitor shall move or otherwise handle another's exhibit. Exhibitors may not handle their own exhibits while the show is open to the public without permission from the Shell Show Chairperson.
- 7. During the show, no exhibit or portion thereof may be removed. Anyone removing an exhibit prior to the show closing will be excluded from exhibiting in future shell shows.
- 8. Exhibitors must remove all exhibits between the hours of 4:15 PM and 6:00 PM on Saturday, March 5th. Please note the 4:15 PM time. We allow 15 minutes to clear the public and exhibitors for an orderly takedown. Scientific Exhibitors must re-enter through the west facing double doors. Artistic Exhibitors must re-enter through the double doors facing Periwinkle Way. Exhibitors must inform Shell Show officials if someone other than the exhibitor is removing their exhibit. Shell Show officials will remove exhibits not removed by 6:00 PM. Exhibitor will then be responsible for retrieval of his/her exhibit. Exhibitor is responsible for obtaining his/her own help with carrying out his/her exhibit(s).
- 9. Evaluation of the merits of exhibits and the distribution of awards is solely the responsibility of the judges, whose decisions will be final. Awards in each class will be given only to the extent that the judges determine exhibits are of sufficient merit.
- 10. Noncompetitive exhibits may be entered in the show with permission of and at the **sole discretion of the Division Chairperson.** They will be allowed only on a space-available basis with priority always given to competitive exhibits.
- 11. Suggestions or complaints concerning the show must be directed to the Shell Show Chairperson only. Any unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be discussed at the next meeting of the Sanibel-Captiva Shell Club Board of Directors and appropriate action will be taken, including possible expulsion from future shows for a minimum of one year or perhaps longer.
- 12. **DISCLAIMER POLICY:** Exhibitor agrees and recognizes the Sanibel-Captiva Shell Club and the Sanibel Community Association shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for damage to or loss of the exhibitor's or vendor's property. This includes but is not limited to exhibits, items for sale, and personal property of the exhibitor or his/her staff or guests. It includes losses of every nature including but not limited to damage, destruction, and theft. Exhibitor acknowledges having been advised to obtain insurance to cover such potential losses.
- 13. Unsigned entry forms will not be processed.

SCIENTIFIC DIVISION RULES - Applicable to Scientific Division Exhibits only.

- 1. All scientific exhibit tables are 2 feet 6 inches (30 inches) deep, front to back.
- 2. Total exhibit width is limited to <u>40 feet</u>. Every effort is made to avoid wrapping exhibits. <u>Note- If the width of the exhibit changes</u> from what is stated on the entry form, the exhibitor is required to notify the Scientific Chair no later than two weeks prior to the shell show. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of the exhibit.
- 3. If an exhibit includes an upright poster or panel, its height from tabletop shall not exceed 36 inches, including stands or supports, and its back shall be plain and finished, preferably in a dark color, so as not to detract from exhibits on the other side of the back-to-back tables.
- 4. The entire exhibit must be in enclosed cases except for the backboards. These cases may or may not have the ability to be locked during show. They should be unlocked for judging so that judges can remove and examine individual specimens, as they deem necessary. If the exhibitor chooses to keep the exhibit cases locked during judging, he/she recognizes that his/her exhibit may receive a lesser award if judges wanted, but were unable, to remove specimens for examination. A single specimen within an exhibit in any class that is too large to be in an enclosed case may be entered with approval of the Scientific Chairperson.
- 5. Specimens must not be sprayed or coated with acrylic, lacquer or other artificial glazes.
- 6. An exhibit that received a First Place Award at a previous Sanibel Shell Show is ineligible as a competitive exhibit in the same category unless the exhibit has been changed more than fifty percent.
- 7. "Self-collected" means personally collected from the species' natural habitat; personally retrieved on a boat from a trap, net or dredge; or personally retrieved on shore from beach drift or scallop dump. "Self-collected" does not include loaned, gifted, purchased or traded specimens. "Self-collected" specimens may be designated by a red star or dot on the label if they are not in a self-collected exhibit class.
- 8. All specimens must be labeled with full scientific name (genus, species or subspecies, author, date) and locality where collected. A diagrammatic chart, like the sample below may be used for labeling.



- (a) Genus & Species: The Latin or Latinized names are in italic. The genus name is capitalized. The species name is not capitalized. Leave space between genus and species name as shown above.
- (b) Author & Date: The person who first described and named the species and the year of authorship. When author and date are in parenthesis, it means that the species has been reclassified into a genus different from the one in which the author originally placed it.
- (c) Current scientific shell name: The WoRM website has the currently accepted name of the shell. Website: http://www.marinespecies.org

NOTE: Remember to add a brief description of your exhibit(s) on the entry form in the space provided following the measurements of your exhibit. This is to help us ensure that your exhibit is in the right class.

SCIENTIFIC JUDGING CRITERIA

All Scientific Exhibits at the Sanibel Shell Show will be judged by our Judges, in accordance with the recommended standards for judging, as outlined in the American Conchologist, March 2001 issue. Clear criteria are important for exhibitors, when creating an exhibit, and Judges during the judging process to provide a clear, systematic basis for judging. See criteria below.





- 1. GRADES K-6. Shells and/or sea life. Multiple or single shell. Worldwide. Any source
- 2. GRADES 7-12. Shells and/or sea life. Multiple or single shell. Worldwide. Any source

SINGLE SHELL CLASSES - One specimen only

- 3. SANIBEL-CAPTIVA Self-collected
- 4. FLORIDA-CARIBBEAN Self-collected
- 5. FLORIDA-CARIBBEAN Any source
- 6. WORLDWIDE Self-collected
- 7. WORLDWIDE Any source
- 8. UNUSUAL VARIANTS (Albino, freak, etc.) Any source

- 20. EDUCATIONAL. Shells intended primarily to teach. Any source
- 21. LAND or FRESH WATER SHELLS Any source
- 22. UNUSUAL VARIANTS (Albino, freak, etc.) Any source
- 23. FOSSILS (Shells and/or other Sea Life) Any source
- 24. SEA LIFE OTHER THAN SHELLS Coral, echinoderm, etc. Any source
- 25. SPECIAL An exhibit that does not fit into any of the above classes
- 26. MINIATURES Adult shells only, maximum size 1 inch. May be a general, regional, or specialized collection.
- 27. BEGINNING SCIENTIFIC EXHIBITOR: Any person over the age of 18 who has not exhibited in a recognized shell show prior to the current Shell Show season. This category applies to the first year of exhibiting only.
- 28. ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS The objective of this class is to bring attention to how mollusks are impacted by issues including, but not limited to: pollution, ocean acidification, collecting practices pertaining to sustainability, climate change, and habitat destruction. Any source.

Examples:

- a. How invasive Apple snails devastate the native populations and how they affect the wetlands and marshes they live in
- b. The effect warmer waters have on mollusks
- c. The impact of microplastics on mollusks and marine life

SINGLE SHELL OR MULTIPLE SHELL CLASSES

- 29. BEST OF THE BLUES. Limited to any exhibit that has previously won a Blue Ribbon at any past Sanibel Shell Show and has not won a major award at any shell show. These exhibits are eligible for the du Pont Trophy and the Conchologists of America Award.
- 30. SANIBEL PLATINUM AWARD. Limited to exhibits that have previously won any major award, such as du Pont, C.O.A., Smithsonian or American Museum of Natural History Award, Masters, Superstar, Mote Gold, or Clench at any shell show. Exhibits in this class are not eligible for any additional award except "Shell of the Show" and the "People's Choice Award."

SCIENTIFIC DIVISION SPECIAL AWARDS 2023 SANIBEL SHELL SHOW

DU PONT TROPHY

This annual award is a plaque presented by the Delaware Museum of Natural History to the most outstanding exhibit of mollusks judged as contributing most to the success of the show and is most instructive and inspiring to visitors because of attractiveness, educational value and scientific accuracy. It may be given only to a blue-ribbon winning exhibit that has not been awarded another major award in the present show. The purpose of this award is to advance the cause of amateur Malacology by encouraging the entry of exhibits that will stimulate public interest and increase appreciation of the hobby and the scientific study of mollusks. It may be from Classes 1 – 28.

CONCHOLOGISTS OF AMERICA AWARD

This award consists of a plaque and a pin presented by the Conchologists of America to the scientific exhibit that shows overall excellence and best furthers interest in shells and shell collecting. It may be given only to a blue-ribbon winning exhibit that has not been awarded another major award in the present show. It may be from Classes 1 - 28.

BEST SANIBEL-CAPTIVA SHELLS -- SELF-COLLECTED

Best Sanibel-Captiva Shells in any class.

BEST FLORIDA-CARIBBEAN SHELLS – ANY SOURCE

Best Florida-Caribbean Shells, any source, in Classes 12 and 13.

BEST WORLDWIDE SHELLS - ANY SOURCE

Best Worldwide Exhibit, any source, in Classes 14 and 15.

BEST FOSSILS EXHIBIT - MULTIPLE SHELLS - ANY SOURCE

Best Exhibit in Class 23.

MARILYN NORTHROP AWARD: SHELL OF SHOW -- SELF-COLLECTED

The exhibit that, in the opinion of the Judges, is the best Self-collected Single Shell included in any exhibit. It is awarded for rarity and the condition of the specimen.

EUGENE AND EVELYN SPENCER AWARD

Best Single South Pacific Shell in any exhibit.

SHELL OF SHOW: ANY SOURCE

The exhibit that, in the opinion of the Judges, represents the best single shell from any source in any exhibit. It is awarded for rarity and the condition of the specimen.

SHELL OF SHOW: FOSSIL

The exhibit that, in the opinion of the Judges, represents the best single shell fossil included in any exhibit.

ELSIE MALONE AWARD

Best Young Scientist Exhibit in Classes 1 and 2.

ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS AWARD

Best exhibit in Class 28.

SANIBEL PLATINUM AWARD

Presented to the best Entry in Class 30. It is limited to exhibits that have previously won any broad-category major award, such as the Masters, du Pont, C.O.A., Bosch, Mote, Clench, Masters Award, or other similar major award at any shell show. Entries for the Platinum Award compete only for this one award in the show with the exception of the People's Choice Award.

PEOPLES' CHOICE AWARD - SCIENTIFIC

Presented to the Scientific exhibit voted most outstanding by the public.

BEST OF THE BLUES

This award is presented to the best Entry in Class 29. This is limited to any exhibit that has previously won a Blue Ribbon at any past Sanibel Shell Show and has not won a major award at any shell show. These exhibits are eligible for the du Pont Trophy and the Conchologists of America Award.

JUDGE'S SPECIAL RIBBONS

One award by each Scientific Judge to any Scientific Division exhibit.

JUDGES' MERIT RIBBON

Awarded to a non-blue-ribbon scientific exhibit that both Judges agree was noteworthy of recognition.
